Local Law No. 2 of 1978

A LOCAL LAW RELATING TO CURFEW WITHIN THE
VILLAGE OF VICTORY, NEW YORK.

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Victory,
New York, as follows:

Section 1. Purpose of Local Law. The purpose of this local law is to promote and preserve the health, welfare and property of residents and owners of property located within the Village of Victory, New York, by requiring minors to adhere to a curfew within the limits of said Village after the hour of 10:00 o'clock p.m.

Section 2. Curfew on minors. It shall be and is hereby declared to be unlawful for any minor under the age of eighteen (18) years to be abroad or on the public streets, lanes, alleys, parks, or other public places in the Village of Victory, New York, after the hour of 10:00 p.m. unless accompanied by the parent or guardian of such minor, or unless the business or employment of such minor, engaged in with the consent of the parent or guardian of such minor, makes it necessary to be upon the streets or other public places in said Village after the hour specified herein.

Section 3. Parent, guardian or minor responsible. Any parent or guardian who permits or allows a minor to be abroad upon the streets

or other public places in said Village of Victory, New York, or the minor himself who is abroad upon said streets or other public places in said Village of Victory, New York, contrary to the provisions of Section 2 of Local Law No. 1 of 1978, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine or not less than Ten and 00/100 (\$10.00) Dollars, nor more than Fifty and 00/100 (\$50.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than ten (10) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. Effective date. This Local Law shall take effect immediately.
