

PUBLIC NOTICE OF VILLAGE ORDINANCE

TAKE NOTICE, that the following is an ordinance duly adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Victory, New York, on May 21, 1951, and entered in its minutes, to wit:

At a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Victory, Saratoga County, State of New York, held at the office of said Board in said Village on the 21st day of May, 1951,

ORDINANCE

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Victory, Saratoga County, State of New York, does hereby enact the following ordinance:

Section 1. <u>Limitation of Speed</u>. No person shall operate a motor vehicle or motor cycle upon any public highway within the corporate limits of the Village of Victory, Saratoga County, New York, at a rate of speed in excess of twenty-five miles per hour. This section shall not apply to ambulances, fire vehicles or police vehicles when on emergency trips.

Section 2. Prohibition of All Night Parking. No vehicle shall be parked on any public highway within the corporate limits of the Village of Victory between the hours of 2 A. M. and 6 A. M. during the period beginning December 1 and ending March 1 of each year.

Section 3. Parallel Parking. No vehicle shall be parked on Gates Avenue, New York State Highway No. 32, other than parallel with the edge of the street, headed in the direction of

traffic, and with front and rear wheels not more than six inches from the curb.

Section 4. Stop Streets. Gates Avenue is hereby designated as a main artery of travel, and all vehicles approaching said main artery of travel from any village street shall, before entering the main artery, come to a full stop, unless otherwise directed by a peace officer or signal.

Section 5. Repeal of Prior Ordinances. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Village of Victory, Saratoga County, New York, inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed; provided, however, that such repeal shall be only to the extent of such inconsistency and in all other respects this ordinance shall be in addition to the other ordinances regulating and governing the subject matter covered by this ordinance.

Section 6. Penalty for Speeding Violations. Any person violating any of the provisions of Section 1 of this ordinance shall upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not to exceed one hundred doblars or by imprisonment of not to exceed thirty days or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 7. Penalty for other Violations. Any mersons violating any of the provisions of Sections 2, 3 and 4 of this ordinance shall be punishable for the first offense by a fine not to exceed ten dollars, and for the second offense by a fine of not less than ten dollars or more than twenty five dollars or by imprisonment for not less than two nor more than fifteen days. The third or any subsequent offense within one year shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars or by imprisonment not exceeding six months or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Affirmative: Unanimous. The Mayor declared the ordinance duly adopted.
