## PUBLIC NOTICE OF VILLAGE ORDINANCE

TAKE NOTICE, that the following is an Ordinance duly adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Victory, New York, on the <u>18 day</u> of September, 1963, and entered in its minutes, to-wit:-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF VICTORY, NEW YORK, PROHIBITING HUNTING AND THE DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS, ETC., WITHIN THE VILLAGE CORPORATE LIMITS.

THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, of the Village of Victory, Saratoga County, New York does hereby enact the following Ordinance in the matter of the government of said Village, to-wit:

SECTION I: No person, firm or corporation shall fire, discharge or set off, or cause or procure to be fired, discharged or set off, within the corporate limits of the Village of Victory any gun, rifle, pistol, revolver, or any other firearm whatsoever; nor any long bow; nor any explosive; nor any air or any spring gun, pistol or rifle; nor any other instrument or weapon in which the propelling force consists of springs, air, tension or gun powder; or any other explosive combustible or instrument whatsoever capable of injuring persons or damaging property.

SECTION II: Hunting within the corporate limits of the Village of Victory is hereby prohibited.

SECTION III: The violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance by any person shall constitute Disorderly Conduct and a person violating any of the provisions hereof shall be, and hereby is declared a disorderly person and shall be subject to arrest, prosecution and punishment as provided by Section 338 of the Village Law, and any and all Amendments thereof.

SECTION IV: Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liable to a fine of not more than Fifty Dollars (\$ 50.00) and to imprisonment not exceeding thirty (30) days, or to both such fine and imprisonment. SECTION V: The invalidity of any part or section of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity and application of the balance thereof.  $\,$ 

SECTION VI: This Ordinance shall take effect

immediately.
