VILLAGE OF VICTORY

LOCAL LAW 2 OF 2022

A LOCAL LAW ENTITLED: "VILLAGE OF VICTORY PARKING LOCAL LAW"

BE IT ENACTED by the Village Board of the Village of Victory as follows:

Section 1: Title.

The title of this local law shall be "Village of Victory Parking Regulation Law." It may be cited as VOV LL 2-2022.

Section 2: Authority.

This local law is enacted pursuant to the authority of (a) Municipal Home Rule Law Section 10(1)(i), which authorizes a Village to adopt a local law not inconsistent with the provisions of the Constitution or not inconsistent with any general law relating to its property, affairs or government; (b) Vehicle and Traffic Law ("VTL") Section 1640, which authorizes the legislative body of any Village, subject to the limitations imposed by VTL Section 1684, to enact traffic regulations (including, without limitation, parking regulations, pedestrian crossing regulations, regulation of traffic at intersections and on through highways, and creation of one-way and limited access highways) in such Village by local law, ordinance, order, rule or regulation; and (c) Village Law ("VL") Section 20-2002, which provides that any orders, rules or regulations adopted by the Board of Trustees of a Village pursuant to VTL Sections 1640 and/or 1643 shall take effect immediately upon adoption (subject to the limitations imposed by VTL Section 1684), without notice or hearing, providing traffic control devices are placed and maintained in accordance with the Uniform Traffic Control Manual and Regulations of the New York State Department of Transportation.

Section 3: Legislative Intent; Conflict With Other Provisions.

It is the intent and purpose of this local law to enact parking regulations within the Village of Victory. Nothing herein shall be read to diminish any of the procedural or substantive rights of the Village of Victory established elsewhere in other local laws and ordinances of the Village of Victory.

Section 4: Parking Restrictions.

- 4.1 <u>Definitions of Words and Phrases</u>. For purposes of this local law, the following terms shall have the following meanings:
 - 4.1.1 Any words or phrases used in this local law which are defined in Title I, Article 1 of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law shall have the meanings ascribed to them therein

- 4.1.2 The following words and phrases, which are not defined in Title I, Article 1 of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section for the purposes of this local law:
 - 4.1.2.1 COUNTY means the County of Saratoga.
 - 4.1.2.2 EVEN NUMBERED DAYS are determined by the even-numbered dates of each month, such as 2, 4, 6, 8, and so forth.
 - 4.1.2.3 EVEN NUMBERED SIDE means the side of the street that has house numbers that are even.
 - 4.1.2.4 ODD NUMBERED DAYS are determined by the odd-numbered dates of each month, such as 1, 3, 5, 7, and so forth.
 - 4.1.2.5 ODD NUMBERED SIDE means the side of the street that has house numbers that are odd.
 - 4.1.2.6 OFFICAL TIME STANDARD Whenever certain hours are named herein or on traffic control devices, they shall mean the time standard which is in current use in this state.
 - 4.1.2.7 PUBLIC GARAGE means any building or facility where motor vehicles are parked, stored, serviced or repaired, and whose space and facilities are available to the public, with or without fee or charge, without regard to residence, business or employment of the motor vehicle owner or operator seeking such space of facilities.
 - 4.1.2.8 STATE means the State of New York.
 - 4.1.2.9 TOWN means the Town of Saratoga.
 - 4.1.2.10 VILLAGE means the Village of Victory, Saratoga County, New York.
 - 4.1.2.11 WINTER SEASON means the period from November 1 of each year to March 31 of the following year.
- 4.2 <u>Parking Vehicles in Violation of Seasonal Alternate Parking Restrictions</u>. No person shall park any vehicle on any public highway or bridge within the corporate limits of the Village of Victory, Saratoga County, New York in violation of the following seasonal, alternate-side parking restrictions:
 - 4.2.1 <u>Seasonal Alternate Parking</u>. During the Winter Season, for twenty-four hour periods commencing at 8:00 p.m., Vehicles shall be parked in the Village only on the odd-numbered side of the street on odd-numbered days of the month and

only on the even-numbered side of the street on even-numbered days of the month. The date of the day at 8:00 p.m. determines the side on which parking is allowed. When a person parks on a side of a street where parking is allowed for 24 hours on odd days and it is an odd-numbered day of the month at the time the person is parking and it is after 8:00 p.m., the person may allow the vehicle to remain in that spot until 8:00 p.m. of the following day, when the vehicle must be moved to the other side of the street which will allow the same parking for 24 hours after 8:00 p.m. on the even-numbered date of the month.

4.3 <u>Stopping, Parking or Standing Vehicles in Violation of Posted Signs</u>. No person shall stop, park or leave standing any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, on any public highway, bridge, structure, access drive, or other place within the corporate limits of the Village of Victory, Saratoga County, New York, where posted to the contrary.

Section 5: Removal of Illegally Stopped, Parked or Standing Vehicles.

- 5.1 <u>Authority To Remove</u>. Any vehicle stopped, parked or standing on any public highway, bridge, structure, access drive or other place within the corporate limits of the Village of Victory, Saratoga County, New York, may be removed and conveyed by or under the direction of the Mayor of the Village or a member of the Village of Victory Public Works Department, by means of towing the same to any public garage whenever:
 - 5.1.1 Such vehicle shall be found parked in violation of Sections 4.2 and 4.2.1 of this local law; or
 - 5.1.2 Such vehicle shall be found stopped, parked or standing in violation of Section 4.3 of this Law, or in violation of any other Village, County or State ordinance, law, code rule or regulation; or
 - 5.1.3 It is necessary to move such vehicle during or following a snow storm to facilitate snow removal or during flood, fire or other public emergency; or
 - 5.1.4 Such vehicle is found within a no-parking-tow away zone, when posted, within the corporate limits of the Village of Victory.
- 5.2 <u>Removal at Owner's Expense</u>. Whenever a vehicle is removed under circumstances set forth in Section 5.1, such removal shall be at the owner's risk and the cost of removal and storage of any vehicle as herein authorized shall be a lien on any vehicle so removed and stored and may be collected by a public sale thereof.
- 5.3 <u>Retrieval by Owner.</u> Before the owner of a vehicle so removed and stored shall be permitted to remove such vehicle, he shall furnish to the Village Clerk:
 - 5.3.1 Satisfactory evidence of identity and ownership;
 - 5.3.2 A receipt from the garage or storage facility to which said vehicle was removed, indicating that all towing and storage charges have been paid; and

- 5.3.3 Proof that said vehicle shall be removed by and towed or driven by a person holding a valid operator's or chauffeur's license.
- 5.4 <u>Clerk's Records</u>. The Village Clerk shall keep a record of:
 - 5.4.1 Owners of vehicles so removed and stored;
 - 5.4.2 Other persons claiming the same;
 - 5.4.3 License number of said vehicle; and
 - 5.4.4 Such other descriptive matter as may identify said vehicle, and the nature and circumstances of removing and storing said vehicle as well as they may be ascertained.
- 5.5 <u>Prosecution Rights Reserved</u>. The provisions in Sections 5.1 through 5.4 of this local law regarding the removal of vehicles, shall not in any way be interpreted or construed so as to prevent or stay the prosecution of an owner or driver of a vehicle for the violation of any ordinance, law, code, rule or regulation on account of which said vehicle was removed and stored.
- <u>Section 6</u>: <u>Enforcement and Penalties</u>. Any person who violates any provision of this local law, as amended from time to time, shall be guilty of a traffic infraction and shall, upon conviction, be subject to such fines and penalties as provided in Section 1800 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York, and the acts amendatory and supplemental thereto.

Section 7: Severability.

If any term or provision of this local law, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, shall to any extent be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this local law, or the application of such term or provision to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby, and each term and provision of this local law shall be valid and be enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.

This local law shall take effect upon adoption and filing with the Secretary of State, as provided in Section 27(3) of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
