Fire Prevention Day at Schuylerville Central School

David Nevins Fire Department Volunteers Engage Students in Fire Safety Education

Schuylerville Central School recently hosted an informative and interactive Fire Prevention Day, welcoming volunteers from the David Nevins Fire Department. The event provided students with valuable lessons on fire safety, hands-on demonstrations, and timely advice for the upcoming winter season.

Fire Hose Demonstration

One of the highlights of the day was the fire hose demonstration led by the fire department volunteers. Students had the opportunity to learn about the equipment firefighters use during emergencies. - Never leave candles unattended and keep them away from curtains or other combustible materials.
- Have an escape plan in case of a fire and practice it regularly.
- Be cautious when using fireplaces, and have chimneys inspected and cleaned annually.

Fire Prevention Day at Schuylerville Central School was a successful and educational event thanks to the dedication of the David Nevins Fire Department volunteers. Their hands-on approach and practical advice have equipped students with the knowledge to stay safe and prepared, especially as winter nears.
