BLOCK GRANT

Village of Victory Awarded \$600,000 in Community Development Grant

Victory, NY — The Village of Victory has been awarded \$600,000 in Community Development Block Grant funds through the New York State Office of Community Renewal (OCR), administered by New York State Homes and Community Renewal (HCR), to support rehabilitation of 1-4 unit residences for income-eligible residents.

The award is part of a broader statewide housing investment announced by Governor Kathy Hochul, aimed at strengthening housing stability and improving living conditions for households across New York State. Locally, the funding will enable the Village of Victory to address critical housing needs by addressing health and safety issues in older housing.

Words from the Mayor

"Safe and stable housing is essential to the health of our residents and the long-term vitality of our community," said Village Mayor Corey Helwig. "This CDBG Program award allows Victory to directly invest in improving housing conditions for eligible homeowners while ensuring compliance with state and federal standards."



Do you have Lead or Galvanized Water pipes in your home?

The Schuylerville-Victory Water Department are requires by the EPA to develop a Lead Service Line Inventory of all homes connected to the water system. This will be a ongoing project until there is 100% verification.

The following is meant to assist residents in either identifying and reporting their service lines or scheduling to have a water department representative come to their home and identify their service line.
